Purpose and Goals

- Generate valid, quantitative and qualitative data regarding homelessness
- Gain better understanding of needs of the homeless community
- Increase San Bernardino County's share of competitive federal funding for homeless services
- Compare new data with 2003 study



Methodology

- Homeless Census
 - Street count of all 244 census tracts
- Shelter count from emergency shelters, transitional housing facilities, and hotels and motels accepting vouchers
- Homeless Survey
 - 697 one-on-one peer interviews conducted by homeless individuals



How Many are Homeless?

- Who was counted?
 - 7,331 homeless residents counted
 - 778 of these people were in families
 - 2,874 were living in cars, RV's/vans or encampments
- Where were they counted?
 - 83% were on the street
 - 12% were in emergency shelters
 - 6% were in transitional housing facilities

Sources of Increase


- 7
- □ Shelter inventory Little change
- Big increases in unincorporated areas
- Biggest net increase in District 3 (+841)
 Biggest % increases in District 4 (122%) & District 3 (80%)
- Big increases in # of people in vehicles
- City of San Bernardino/District 5 slight change
- Migration of homeless from LA and Riverside Counties
- Homeless still overwhelmingly local in origin
- Younger homeless population/shorter episodes



*This includes 133 additional persons reported in Domestic Violence shelters across the County, whose District location is unknown. Adding these 133 DV persons to the known Supervisorial distribution (7198) equals the County total of 7331.






Supervisorial District Distribution (Street Only)










According to HUD's Annual Homeless Report to Congress, nearly one quarter of the sheltered homeless are 17 years or younger.



Veteran Status





Residency – Where Living when Last Became Homeless



Length of Homelessness







Disabling Conditions



Number of Disabilities








Chronic Homelessness







Reasons For Not Receiving Assistance



Substance Abuse and Recovery




