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Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)

HMIS is a software application designed to record and store client-level information on the characteristics and service needs of homeless persons. HMIS is typically a webbased software application that homeless assistance providers use to coordinate, care, manage their operations, and better serve their clients.

- HMIS implementations can encompass geographic areas ranging from a single county to an entire state.
 HMIS knits together homeless assistance providers within a community and creates a more coordinated and effective housing and service delivery system.
- The U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and other planners and policymakers at the federal, state and local levels use aggregate HMIS data to obtain better information about the extent and nature of homelessness over time.
- Specifically, HMIS can be used to produce an unduplicated count of homeless persons, understand patterns of service use, and measure the effectiveness of homeless programs.

HUD Priorities

- First priority is to bring on board emergency shelters, transitional housing, and outreach programs.
- Second priority is to bring providers of permanent supportive housing funded by HUD McKinney-Vento Act programs and other HUD programs.
- Third priority is to recruit homelessness prevention programs, Supportive Services Only programs funded through HUD's Supportive Housing Program, and non-federally funded permanent housing programs.

Implementation of HMIS would not only satisfy the HUD mandate, but also provide the San Bernardino County Continuum of Care with a means to measure the effectiveness of programs serving homeless people. The

system will also provide service providers with a way to better manage and evaluate their programs and services.
