# **Programming and Services**

- Probation staff will be requesting a Release of Information for Community Based Organization services; please share information with known providers who may be interested in program
- Vendors will need to be registered to County's EPro system
- Process will take time but will allow for transparency

- Added benefit to having vendors registered, we may find programs that can benefit youth the group may not have previously considered
- Mentoring Program want to use successful models

- With program name selected, workgroup can continue to discuss form changes

#### Roundtable

#### Julie Francis -

- Friday, February 5<sup>th</sup>, DCPO Francis and staff will visit potential vendor for Gateway TO ARISE furniture
- A request for modifications to be completed for Gateway TO ARISE has been submitted; requesting
  capital improvement funds be used to raise shower heads, replace flooring, paint with non-institution
  colors, install water temperature controls, cabinetry and microwaves
- Looking to modify more usable space for long-term stay, without a Juvenile Hall feel
- DJJ has not been able to provide information on services they currently provide
- Discussion regarding clothing for population; similar to Gateway, dockers and collared shirts
  - Suggestion made to have first group of youth create the logo design for the program;
     possibility of using silk screen program
- Discussed possible tour of Gateway TO ARISE prior to opening
- Discussed keeping part of facility as is for detention youth
  - o 1POD has two living units and will be used for Juvenile Hall population
  - 2POD, extending to 3POD, will be used to house DJJ youth; once the ages of youth are determined, living arrangements can be made

#### Anabel Romero –

Is there any interest in cross collaboration with other counties? At this time, San Bernardino County
is ahead of most counties and more than likely we will be sharing what we have done; there is a
possibility of a Southern California workgroup (regionalized); we are in discussion with other
counties to house female population
