Coordinator's Remarks

Probation Officer III Yaquelin Galvan

- The Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) lock-up inspections have been confirmed with only six inspections left to complete. Once all inspections are completed the final outcomes will be submitted to Chief Probation Officer Michelle Scray Brown and Judge Annemarie Pace.
- All commissioner mileage reimbursement forms have been submitted for processing to San Bernardino County Probation's Fiscal Department. According to Welfare and Institutions Code 231 it states the reimbursement expenses for mileage may not exceed \$25 each month.
- The California Probation, Parole & Correctional Association (CPPCA) conference has been confirmed for September 6, 2018 in San Diego. The appropriate paperwork will be submitted to the Board of Supervisors for approval. Once approved, Chairperson Earl Smith and Secretary Diana Martin will be registered for the conference.
- The manual for the JJDPC commission has been updated and given to the executive committee for review. Once the manual is finalized by the executive committee, a copy will be provided to each Commissioner and the manual will be posted on the probation website.
- The nomination form for the JJDPC Service to Youth Awards has been updated and sent out to local agencies. The form will also be sent to the Commission electronically.
- The location for the JJDPC Service to Youth Awards has yet to be determined as the Board of Supervisors chambers will be under construction during the month of October.
- Presented information on the JJDPC at the Gangs and Drugs Task Force meeting. Flyers and brochures were handed out, as well as the nomination form for the awards ceremony.
- Discussed the idea of creating a PowerPoint about the commission so that Commissioners can use it for recruitment events and presentations.
- The JJDPC application has been updated to include education information.

- Requested an update on the business cards for the commission. Coordinator Galvan stated that she will follow up with more information on this matter.
- The congratulatory letter for Probation Officer Joseph Turner will be sent congratulating him for winning the Officer of the Year award through the International Footprint Association.
- Sonoma County has reported having issues with group homes and their inspections. The commission plans to review what it's responsibilities are regarding group home inspections.
- The committee for the Teacher's Awards Ceremony received a list of all schools in the county. The committee will work towards narrowing down the criteria for the award ceremony.
- The Commission would like to create a list of trends they've noticed at the facilities they're inspecting in order to go over the information found.
