CFO Update Matthew Erickson</p>	<p>CFO Matthew Erickson presented and reviewed the 2023-24 Recommended Community Correction Partnership Allocations</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) State budget was released in January, providing new estimates for AB109 funding than those provided at the November 30, 2022 meeting <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. Recommended FY2023-24 Ongoing Budget is based at \$144.7 million b. Ongoing New Funding for Staffing totaled \$6.5 million; this represents existing services c. Inflationary Costs allocated to all Departments based on existing allocations totaled \$5 million d. \$10.2 million allocated for available programs e. One Time Funding allocated at \$70 million; 20% set aside for Reserve totaling \$28 million, remaining with \$41 million f. Breakdown of Recommended One-Time Uses provided; leaving a remaining balance of \$9.4 million 2) Recommendation was made for Community Corrections Partnership committee to approve allocations based on funding available with proposed new allocation of \$144 million; Departments should continue to work with the County Administrative Office on proposals to determine funding available for programs 3) Comments – <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a.
