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2. Approve Minutes of November 30 and August 30, 2011	<p>Motioned by DA Ramos and seconded by Undersheriff S Abernathy to approve minutes as written.</p> <p><b>Action:</b> Include names in Minutes to comply with Brown Act.</p>
<p>3. AB109 Public Safety Realignment Plan Updates</p> <p>4. FY 2012/2013 Budget Proposals</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li> <p><u>Linda Haugan</u> - Human Services departments will continue to be heavily impacted until Day Reporting Centers (DRCs) are operational.</p> <p>Dept. of Behavioral Health (DBH) – Requesting \$4,431,685. Some clients may be eligible for Medical or Arrowcare which could offset services and reduce gross.</p> <p>64 referrals received since October 2011; 10 from Probation. Of the 64, 54 were confirmed to meet criteria for the Enhanced Outpatient Program (EOP) which requires intensive case management. Probation staff have picked up these patients from state facility because they are unable to function on their own. Due to teamwork among departments, DBH is able to respond immediately.</p> <p>Public Health – Requesting \$115,423.</p> <p>Children &amp; Family Svcs – Requesting \$105,000</p> <p>DAAS – Requesting \$89,172</p> <p>TAD - Requesting \$7266 &amp; \$70,021 for Workforce Development Specialist from WDD.</p> </li> <li> <p><u>District Attorney</u> – Requesting \$1,693,740 (\$500,000 addition from last year’s budget of \$1,193,740) to hire additional Victim Advocates. Victim Services Bureau is heavily impacted; numerous citizens asking why someone who victimized them is back on the street. Requesting augmentation of \$500,000 to return staff to pre-2008 levels. DA keeping own crime stats to determine increase in types of crimes; also collecting stats from cities. Crime rates nationwide had been decreasing.</p> <p>Chief Scray asked if stats would be collected prior to October 1 for comparison of crime stats trend. District Attorney will research stats prior to October 1 to determine if crime rates were increasing before PRCS releases.</p> </li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Public Defender</u> – Requesting \$1,624,785 which excludes state funds as unknown if money will be received; last year state provided \$427,000. Funding to reclass OAll to OAlll and continue full funding for 4 Deputy Public Defender positions. 116 PRCS revocation cases filed since October with only one lawyer handling; working with Probation and DA to improve. Unknown if new crimes are committed.</li> <li>• <u>Sheriff's Department</u> – Requesting \$29,799.739.</li> </ul> <p>Last year's allocations were adequate, but department is now operating as a state prison. Crime is increasing, and serious inmates require higher level of escort. Since October, 6000 people in Work Release Electronic Monitoring program. Department is aggressively seeking out-of-custody programs.</p> <p>All detention facilities need upgrades and must comply with American with Disabilities Act (ADA) to accommodate all state prisoners and parolees.</p> <p>Public Comment from Anthony Armstrong: – Inquired if Sheriff supporting bail reduction to relieve inmate population. Sheriff has not discussed SB 968 or SB 1441 nor has he taken an official position.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Probation – Chief Scray provided preliminary stats (handout) for last 5 months. ICE stats are not included because they are being held even though technically released; if not being deported, they will come to SBCO. PRCSs with no address are being counted as homeless; working with CDCR to provide addresses instead of listing self paroled.</li> </ul> <p>Violent priors are assigned to specialized units. If offender on medication when released from CDCR, they are counted as Mental Health. COMPAS scores are serious offenders (180 &amp; 237) and approximately 30% of population. From October to February, CDCR estimated 1400 cases, but Probation has received 2100. Files improving but lacking addresses and mental health data.</p> <p>Last years' budget was a 9-month budget. Increases in CBO services, GPS tracking and transition housing contracts for FY 12/13.</p>
5. FY 2012/2013 Budget Review	<p>Of the original FY 2012/2013 budget, Allan Rawland suggested that each department reduce their budget to proportional share.</p> <p><b>Action:</b> Motioned by Undersheriff Abernathy and seconded by Linda Haugan for individual members to review budgtet proposals and return in two weeks for final committee review/approval.</p>

Roundtable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Probation</u> – Officers will be assigned to sxi cities with highest crime rates beginning March 26.</li> </ul> <p>Committee to focus on Governor’s \$62 million budget as unknown what new formula will be. Revenue issue is serpate.</p> <p>Allan Rawland inquired onhow data can be obtained from ARMC on the number of PRCs being admitted and if they are budgeting to cover additional costs.</p> <p><b>Action:</b> Chief Scray to contact ARMC Director Patrick Petre to inquire if CDCR is contacting ARMC.</p> <p>Allan Rawland retiring and thanked everyone for working together. Chief Scray thanked Allan for his leadership, the excellent working relationship and years of successful collaboration.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>Linda Haugan</u> – Inquired if web interface LEADS (parolee info) is being used. Chief Scray responded that department is utilizing.</li> </ul>
