3. Approve Minutes of February 19, 2013	Motioned by Chief Mendenhall and seconded by Sheriff McMahon to approve minutes as written; unanimous.		

4. Data Collection	Chief Brown has requested reports from other counties, but reports are not available. Handout of report produced by the Board of State and Corrections (BSCC) regarding the County's implementation of the Community Corrections Partnership plan. Concern expressed that state's report is incomplete and does not provide a clear picture.
	There is approximately \$400,000 to \$600,000 in planning money. Chief Brown proposed to use the planning money to contract with Cal State for data collection to produce various reports. Proposed three year contract at \$125,000 per year. The committee will have control of content and review report before it goes to print. If approved, the Probation Department would sign contract with Cal State.
	Mary Davis commented that the court has contracted with Cal State and very satisfied with their work.
	<u>Action</u> : Motioned by Sheriff McMahon and seconded by Chris Gardner to contract with Cal State to collect data and produce reports; unanimous.
5. AB109 Report	AB 109 Annual Report will cover 18 months. Chief Brown will email draft to members and requested that members provide information and feedback to her within a week.
	Important that County's report is made available soon to reflect the impact and developed programs.
6. Growth Funding Budget	At the February meeting it was approved that the Sheriff's Department would receive any growth funds. The Governor's May Revision cut the growth funds by 40%. Unknown how much money will be received. The funds will be used for expansion of the Adelanto facility which is targeted to open in January 2014. The facility's ongoing cost is 5.3 million; the CEO will find the one time money.
	When the funding is received, the Sheriff's Department is to provide a copy for public record.
7. Roundtable	Chief Brown presented a letter of support for funding under the Second Chance Act Phase Two of the Adult Reentry Program. The County Public Health Department is applying for funding through the Reentry Program for the Bridging Reentry Integration by Driving Goal-oriented Effective Strategies (BRIDGES) Program. The

Public Health Department facilitated the development of a countywide Reentry Strategic Plan to ensure successful reintegration.		
	<u>Action</u> : Executive Committee agreed to sign letter of support; lett circulated for signatures at end of meeting.

The San Bernardino County Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) Executive Committee supports the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department grant application for funding through SB1022. The CCP was created in 2011 to establish a joint plan for public safety realignment through rehabilitation and community supervision of offenders. The CCP will be updated in late 2013.

The mission of CCP is to maintain a collaborative partnership among all members to enable San Bernardino County to aid offenders with their reintegration into society through assessment, treatment, and provide a range of effective services and programs. The CCP will continue to supervise out-of-custody inmates as well as collaborate with the San Bernardino County Workforce Development Department to provide job readiness and skills to prevent recidivism.

The Sheriff's Department and the Probation Department share the responsibility of managing incarcerated and post-incarcerated offenders. The CCP utilizes a number of methods including: flash incarceration, home confinement and house arrest, electronic monitoring with global positioning system, and work release. Currently there is a probation officer assigned to each of the Type II jails. Within San Bernardino County, there are three Day Reporting Centers available to post-incarcerated offenders offering similar reintegration services presented to incarcerated offenders. The San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department and the Probation Department have created a seamless transition from incarceration to rehabilitation to re-entry.

The CCP Executive Committee supports the vision of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department SB 1022 Grant Proposal and believes receiving the funding will enable the county jails to offer an enhanced programming and treatment environment and prepare the inmate for successful re-entry into society.
