## **Probation Update**

Shawn Arrington, Division Director I for ARISE:

- Current population 74; 71 males and 3 females.
- We've had 6 releases.
- We've had 4 commitments: 3 new and 1 re-commitment (failed probation terms).
- 1 youth still at Pine Grove and 2 youth at Boys Republic.
- New dry trailer on grounds that will house the DBH staff.

Mary Garcia, Division Director I for SOAR:

- The anticipated opening date is in June, we're still in the construction phase.
- A tour will be provided to this committee upon completion.
- The population total will be 10, with an overflow unit.

Shonna Rossler, Programming Manager:

- In October we started out innovative strategies contract; this helps fill each day with programming and classes that are offered throughout the day.
- New programming being offered music therapy, financial literacy, communication building, art therapy, Spanish classes, entrepreneurial, and improv/acting classes.
- We've also implemented a 360-feedback loop, to measure outcomes and success of the programs.
  - Sandy Bonilla –February 1<sup>st</sup>, we are having a career day for Urban Forestry, we're hiring for jobs, and this would be a good opportunity for youth to be made aware of the jobs that are available once released. I will share the information and provide a zoom link to the group.
  - Information will be available for the youth at ARISE via ZOOM and shared with our Day Reporting Centers.

## **Roundtable**

Don English, Superintendent of County Schools:

- Currently working on chronic absenteeism rate, currently 35-40%. We're working to reduce the number of suspensions and expulsions.
- There has been a decrease in behavior issues.
- The focus is to get kids and teenagers to school.

Terrance Stone, Young Visionaries:

- Saturday, January 20<sup>th</sup> we are hosting All About the Children Day, we're anticipating 3000 kids. There will be toys, backpacks, diapers, and other giveaways.
