Chief's Remarks:

Division Director II Kathleen Huaman on behalf of Chief Probation Officer Tracy Reece.

The following legislation was <u>not</u> passed by the Governor:

- AB448 Family Findings: Requires efforts to locate kin/siblings/relatives whenever a youth might be placed in an out of home placement.
- AB1186 Juvenile Restitution: This bill would remove the ability of the court to require the minor to
 pay monetary restitution to the victim. The bill would authorize the court to instead order the minor to
 make nonmonetary restitution by participating in a community-based restoration program, performing
 community service, or participating in an educational, employment, youth development, or mental
 health program, as specified.
- Request for Proposal: The department has 17 new providers that were approved by the Board of Supervisors:
 - New Community based organizations that will be working with Probation: Inland Empire Rebound; Operation New Hope; Young Visionaries; The Love Program; Dvine Interventions; San Bernardino Fatherhood; San Bernardino Community College District; Advantage Public Institute; Metzli Counseling; Life Builder's Inc.; Moses House Ministries; Telios; Citrus Counseling Services; Simple Solutions; CHORDS; Empowering Success Now and Highlander's Boxing Club.
- On November 15th, Youth Day Reporting Center staff planned a turkey distribution/resource fair at the Victorville Day Reporting Center.
- In January 2024, staff will be involved in awareness rallies and education for human trafficking awareness month.
 - O Commissioner Earl Smith inquired how often organizations are added to the list to assist Probation. He would like to know about county opportunities so he can inform others.
 - Division Director II Kathleen Huaman stated it's based on the request for proposal process via the San Bernardino County ePro which is the official electronic procurement system for San Bernardino County.
 - o Commissioner Chelsea Ramirez would like a copy of the list.
 - Supervising Probation Officer Nathan Clark will email the list of new providers to the Commissioners.
